



THUNDERBALLS 2026 RULES of PLAY

1. Up to 4,000 tickets will be sold.
2. Tickets cost \$10 for a single ticket and \$40 for 5 tickets
3. Tickets can be purchased from CCSS staff, board members, volunteers, Moon's Records, and Seeds Food Market between April 9 and May 18 (or until sold out). A limited number of multiple tickets will be available to purchase online.
4. Tickets may be sold and purchased only in British Columbia.
5. Tickets purchasers must be 19 years of age or older. If a winning ticket bears a minor's name, the prize will be lawfully delivered to the minor's parent, legal guardian, or trustee.
6. Balls will be released Monday May 18th at approximately 9:30 AM on Dunsmuir Avenue between 1st and 2nd Avenue.
7. Balls will remain the property of CCSS.
8. Each ball will be numbered corresponding to the number on each Thunderballs ticket. The individuals's names that appear on the ticket stubs that correspond to the balls in order of finishing will be awarded prizes. A list of prizes and winners will be posted on CCSS social media platforms within 24 hours of the event. Winners will be notified by phone call or email within 1 week.
9. Winning balls will be selected by the Race Marshall.
10. If the draw can't take place as scheduled due to unforeseen circumstances, CCSS will notify ticket holders about the time and location of the substitute draw via social media and our website.
11. By entering, winners consent to the publication and use of their name for advertising, promotion and publicity purposes without additional compensation.
12. No substitutions, cash equivalent prizes, transfers or exchanges of prizes will be provided in lieu of prizes.
13. Chances are 1 in 4,000 to win a grand prize. In the event of unforeseen circumstances the Cumberland Community Schools Society reserves the right to select the winning balls by random draw in accordance with BC Gaming regulations. Organizers reserve the right to cancel Thunderballs 2026 or change any element thereof, with or without notice, at any time, for any reason.
14. Complaints can be brought to the CCSS Events Coordinator. The Events Coordinator will discuss with other CCSS Staff and Board of Directors in an attempt to resolve any issues.
15. Individuals do not need to be present at the event to win a prize.
